PRSA's Western District Conference is being held **April 22-24** in beautiful Newport Beach. Our colleagues in the Orange County chapter have promised a stellar program of speakers and a lot of fun "Making Waves." The keynote speaker will be Peter Shankman of Help a Reporter Out and there will be breakout sessions on everything from story pitching on the West Coast to mobile media marketing strategies.

This conference is a great getaway and a heck of a deal - as little as \$195 for members, \$50 for students and \$102 per person for rooms at the Hyatt Regency. Discount deadlines are March 27 for the room and April 8 for the conference.

The 2009 PRSA International Conference, meanwhile, is slated for **November 7-10** in sunny San Diego. The theme is "Delivering Value" - for your clients, your company and your career! This one is a little pricey but promises more bang for your buck — it's a four-day event that covers all aspects of public relations and offers a national networking opportunity.

PRSA has cut the price, too. Members can attend for \$995 and even pay in four installments. Rooms at the San Diego Marriott Hotel and Marina are as little as \$236 per night. The discount deadline for the conference is September 25.
